

"DEFECTS OF CHARACTER" VERSUS "SHORTCOMINGS"

I was recently reading an interesting article from the winter edition of "Box 459" and there was an article titled "Did You Ever Wonder". The article is as follows:

We are often asked "What is the difference between 'defects of character' in Step Six and 'shortcomings' in Step 7?

According to G.S.O.'s archives Bill W. commented about his use of "Defects of Character" and "Shortcomings" interchangeably in the Steps in a personal letter he wrote dated March 7, 1963.

Thanks for your inquiry, requesting to know the difference between "defects of character' and shortcomings' – as those words appear in the Steps. Actually I don't remember any particular significance in these phases. In my mind, the meaning is identical; I guess I just used two ways of expression, rather than to repeat myself. It's just as simple as that.

In another letter, dated November 16, 1965, Bill again responded to a similar inquiry. His letter read, in part:

When these steps were being done, I didn't want to repeat the phrase 'character defects' twice in succession. Therefore in Seven, I substituted 'shortcomings', thereby equating 'shortcomings' with 'defects'.

When reading most people do equate that way and there seems to be no difficulty. I used them as though they both meant exactly the same thing – which they appear to many people.

I guess it's a problem in semantics, all right. For example, it is possible to say that each time you fall short of an ideal, to that extent is your character defective. Looking at it in the other way, 'shortcomings' can be read as a mere failure to do what should have been done, so I guess you have to take your pick.


I hope you get as much out of this article as I have. I have sat through a lot of AA meetings listening to some of the wildest, craziest, explanations of this and I hope this sets the record straight.
